The Bridge Project - Origins and Goals

Among the official mandates of The Canadian Centre for German and European Studies / Le Centre canadien d'études allemandes et européennes (CCGES / CCEAE) at York University and L'Université de Montréal is fostering international academic mobility with Europe for students and faculty members across Canada. As part of their attention to this mandate, researchers at the Centre's York office focused on the state of academic mobility between Canada and the European Union.

This survey has been conducted on behalf of the Delegation of the European Commission in Canada and has been financed through their generous support.

Report Format

One of The Bridge Project's primary goals has been the creation of a mobility opportunity database that goes beyond the mere listing of programs. In particular, we would like to use the database to facilitate an informed discussion of the policies that shape the nature and extent of the existing links between Canadian and European academic institutions. It is our intention to inaugurate this discussion at the May 26 workshop, along with a consideration of how the results of our work can be configured and presented so as to have maximum value for students and faculty at Canadian post-secondary institutions interested in traveling to EU Member Countries in the frame of a study abroad program.

Please note: Given that no decisions have yet been reached on how the data gathered during The Bridge Project might best be utilized, the format of this preliminary report has been chosen to address the needs of its printed word version and it is not intended to reflect how we envision any potential "final product." Also, that this report lacks an index is a result of the limitations of our resources. Should the project proceed to its logical second phase, addressing this shortcoming would undoubtedly be included in the tasks to be undertaken.

Canada - European Union Program for Co-operation in Higher Education and Training

The **European Union/Canada Cooperation Program in Higher Education and Training** (EU/Canada Program) aims primarily at promoting understanding between the peoples of the European Union and Canada and improving the quality of their human resource development.

The possibility of European Union/Canada cooperation in education and training was envisioned in the Transatlantic Declaration on EU/Canada Relations adopted in November 1990. A formal EU/Canada Cooperation Agreement was concluded in November 1995 and renewed in December 2000 for an additional five years to continue to fund projects focusing on international curriculum development and student mobility, with a greater emphasis on vocational education and training, and language training. Under the first five-year Agreement (1995-2000) a total of 57 transatlantic consortia have been funded involving over 200 EU and Canadian institutions of higher education and training. These consortia projects involve the participation of more than 3.000 students in transatlantic exchanges.

The European Union (EU) is Canada's second most important trading partner. Under this Program, Canada participates with all twenty-five Member States of the European Union (Austria, Belgium, Denmark, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Ireland, Italy, Luxembourg, the Netherlands, Portugal, Spain, Sweden, the United Kingdom, Cyprus, the Czech Republic, Estonia, Hungary, Latvia, Lithuania, Malta, Poland, the Slovak Republic, and Slovenia).

The EU/Canada Programme supports innovative, multilateral, student-centred projects with the potential to stimulate substantive and long-lasting structural transatlantic cooperation in higher education and training. It is not intended to duplicate activities which are or can be carried out on a bilateral basis.

Each multilateral partnership includes a minimum of three higher education or training institutions in three different Member States of the European Community and in two different Canadian provinces. Fourth and subsequent partners may be other types of organisations such as industry and business groups, non-governmental organisations, publishers, government departments, chambers of commerce, and research institutes. Programme funding is intended only for the higher education and training institutions in each consortium. Projects will normally have a duration of 3 years.

The objectives of the EU/Canada Programme are to:

- Promote closer understanding between the peoples of the European Union and Canada, including broader knowledge of their languages, cultures and institutions;
- Improve the quality of human resource development in both the European Union and Canada, including the acquisition of skills required to meet the challenges of the global knowledge-based economy;
- Encourage an innovative and sustainable range of student-centred higher education and training cooperative activities between the different regions in the European Union and in Canada that have a durable impact;

- Improve the quality of Transatlantic student mobility by promoting transparency, mutual recognition of qualifications and periods of study and training, and where appropriate, portability of credits;
- Encourage the exchange of expertise in e-learning and open and distance education and their effective use by project consortia to broaden Programme impact;
- Form or enhance partnerships among higher education and training institutions, professional associations, public authorities, private sector and other associations as appropriate in both the European Union and Canada;
- Reinforce a European Union and a Canadian value-added dimension to Transatlantic cooperation in higher education and training;
- Complement bilateral programmes between the Member States of the European Union and Canada as well as other European Union and Canadian programmes and initiatives.

The EU/Canada Programme is administered jointly by the European Commission's Directorate General for Education and Culture (DG EAC) and by Human Resources and Skills Development Canada (HRDS), in conjunction with the Canadian Department of Foreign Affairs and International Trade. The European Commission (DG Education and Culture) will provide funding for the direct use of the European Community partners, and Human Resources Development Canada (HRSD) will provide funding for the direct use of the Canadian partners.

Projects selected in 2005

The WISE program - Wide(r) Interdisciplinary Systems in Education

The WISE program is an international vocational training program, which organizes transatlantic exchanges between Europe and Canada for 48 European and Canadian (24 each) students at a BA or Masters degree level who are studying to be primary or secondary school teachers.

These students will complete a semester of professional practice on the other side of the Atlantic. This training should allow them, while concentrating on the theme of interdisciplinarity, to develop their intercultural communication skills, as well as their ability to work in a team. It should also allow them to become acquainted with an educational system that is different from the one they know in their country.

Each Canadian Institution sends 4 students abroad for 3 to 4 months and receives 4 European students. The students attend a teaching practicum supervised at the host university by a faculty adviser as well as an interdisciplinary course.

The six universities or institutions participating in the program also finance nearly 41% of the total budget.

Promoting Environmental Management Awareness: A Transatlantic Perspective (“Greening” as a Critical Future Avenue in Environmental Management).

The three Canadian institutions have committed to a partnership that will increase professional learning, cultural awareness and promote student mobility bringing medium and long-term benefits to the partner institutions and their communities and regions. Students will gain in-depth practical learning and experience about European and Canadian approaches and practices regarding environmental management. The partners all offer programs in environmental studies and are involved in international cooperation initiatives thus cultural, economic and political relations between Europe

and Canada will be fostered. A total of about 24 undergraduate Canadian and 21 undergraduate European students will be sent on exchange for usually one term during the life cycle of the project (November 1st, 2005 - October 31st, 2008).

CESAer-Canada-EU Student Exchange Program in Aerospace Engineering

The objective of the CESAer program is to promote transatlantic mobility and the international exposure of Aerospace Engineering to students in order to provide opportunities to strengthen their abilities to make both technical and managerial contributions to international aerospace projects. The program will enable the exchange of 28 graduate students and give an international dimension to their thesis work and research.

Developing International Competence in Health Care

This project will ensure that participating students from Canada and the European Union (EU) have the opportunity to acquire and demonstrate transferable technical competence in their chosen health care profession, and to acquire an understanding of the impact of culture on the provision of health care in an international context. It will facilitate 58 work placement exchanges for 29 Canadian and 29 European undergrad and graduate students in order to enhance international competence; the knowledge, skills and attitudes acquired during an international work placement. It will also promote cultural competence and the internationalization of the curriculum through e-learning case studies, development of a Culture and Health course and the exchange of 20 teaching staff. Furthermore it will support the global mobility of health care graduates through recognition of transferable technical skills and cultural competence.

CEMMENTI: Canada Exchanges with the Mediterranean: Migration Experiences and their impact on Nationalism Trans-nationalism and Identity

A joint curriculum between the partner institutions will be developed in this project that focuses on the study of nationalism, trans-nationalism and migration. The project includes the exchange of teaching staff as well as a total number of 27 Canadian students, hosted by European partner institutions abroad. The project aims to create a common transfer system between the partners that will produce and deliver a new interdisciplinary course on the study of nationalism, trans-nationalism and migration created by the project team. The course modules will also be made available through a website and/or CD ROM.

The Displaced Persons Project: A Euro-Canada Social Work Exchange

The project will offer 32 Canadian and 32 European social work students a quality, supervise, direct practice experience involving up to 24 community based social service agencies working with marginalized/excluded/displaced populations in Europe and Canada. The project will enhance social work students' understanding of displacement as a global social problem and - most importantly - enhance their practical capacities and abilities to address this issue.

The Role of Communications in Promoting Civic Engagement and Democratic Principles

This project will exchange 28 Canadian and 28 European undergrad students in the field of Journalism and involve up to 300 non-mobile students to explore, study and

work towards a better understanding of the role of communication in creating and maintaining what has come to be called "Civil Society". At the same time students will take courses in second languages and cultural studies. The result will be to combine increased understanding of journalism and public relations in the context of the "civil society" with lessons in language, politics, cultural change and human communications in an international setting.

The project aims to create sustainable resources for advanced study and leadership development in the field of health promotion by evolving an international core curriculum, exchange expertise in e-learning, develop a series of course units focusing on cultural diversity and social inclusion and a format for collaboration in e-learning. There will be exchanges of 27 Canadian and 27 European students and 6 faculty staff.

Projects selected in 2004

International training to interdisciplinary approaches for students in teaching from primary and high schools

The main goal is to offer international training to 24 Canadian and 24 European students, who choose a career in teaching, (8 students will come from each of the Canadian institutions) by participating in four month transatlantic work placement exchanges (one semester). This training will allow them to meet the following objectives: enhance their knowledge, develop their intercultural communication, develop an intercultural team work approach, and learn about a school system that is different than the one in their own country.

International Distributed Computer Science Degree

The objective of this project is to address the problem of curriculum development in computer science through student exchange and development and dissemination of international curriculum. The mutual knowledge of the university systems, curriculum content, and teaching methods is an essential condition for continuous improvement of quality of education in computer science. The main component of the project is a transatlantic exchange program for students: a total of about 36 students from Canada will visit Europe and vice versa for one or two terms. In parallel there will be 4 short visits of faculty members to exchange information about their respective curricula and work on developing a joint, international one. In addition to standard university learning, the students will also gain access to internships with private sector industrial partners.

Reframing Education for Open Societies - RESO

The main objective of this project is to give an international dimension to training programs for future teachers from both continents, allowing them to be initiated to a teaching system and pedagogical methods that are different from their home country approaches, in a different culture and using a different language. The project will offer international exchanges to 60 teaching students from Europe and Canada, a total of about 8-12 from each institution over a three year period, during their last training year (a total of 60 students)

Engineers for Global Technological Innovation

The objectives of the project are to establish an engineering mobility program comprising course work and work placement in which at least 24 Canadian (2-3 per year and institution) and 18 European engineering students (both undergrad and graduate) will participate, and to provide practical "key engineering skills" through work placement and internships for participating students.

The project can be part of the academic requirements of the students' degree programme (such as final year project), or as a learning experience subsequent to their studies that will help them gain international experience and learning for their future career. Students also have the option at some partner universities to take courses instead of doing the project, or to do both, depending on their objectives. Part of this programme also entails the provision for inter-cultural and language learning, as well as the provision for obtaining a certified key engineering skill from the host institution (such as advanced automation, rapid prototyping, use of high power lasers in manufacturing, advanced PCB manufacture etc.).

Inequalities in access to health care for rural communities

Seven institutions of higher education offering health programs and involved in international initiatives and cooperation are committed to a partnership that will increase cultural awareness and future student mobility. Medium and long-term beneficial outcomes are expected for the partner institutions, their regions and economic and political relations between the European community and Canada. Canadian and European partners will send 40 and 24 undergrad students (a total of 64 students) for one term to the partner institutions during the life of the project. Students will observe European and Canadian health care approaches, methods and culture.

TRANSFOR: Transatlantic Education for Global Sustainable Forest Sector Development

This educational exchange program will provide students and faculty with an opportunity to understand the immense pressures and changes taking place within the world's forests and the forms of management to sustain and grow forests within Canada and the European Union. Sustainable development related to forests is critical in both Canada and the EU, where the concept of sustainability has an essential role in the EU constitution. The main activities of the proposed program are joint curriculum development, experiential cross cultural learning, and international work internships. In order to learn about forests, students will learn in forests, so that the forests will become the classrooms through cooperation with Research Forests and the Canadian Model Forest Network.

A total of 144 students (promarily undergraduate) will participate in mobility programmes, with 72 students from Canadian and 72 from European universities. 64 students (32 Canadian and 32 European) will spend one semester exchanges with a full academic credit at partners universities and 16 students (8 Canadian and 8 European) will participate in exchange internships. Eight 2-3 week field courses, each attended by at least 8 students, will be conducted with several universities collaborating on delivering courses. Sixteen faculty exchanges (8 Canadian and 8 European) varying in length from three weeks to a semester will be used to promote internationalisation of curricula.

Projects selected in 2003

CIMET - Center for International Maritime Education and Training

This project will establish a center for international maritime education studies and will establish and develop a core set of curricula drawn from the partners and provide training in both classroom and web-based delivery formats to international clientele. Given the importance of mandatory work-based (including sea-going) training in these highly focused vocational education programs (i.e. in nautical science and marine engineering courses) the joint development of web-based and computer-based course materials will be an important spin-off of this collaboration. This will also facilitate the use by non-mobile students of the learning materials developed by the consortium ("virtual mobility") thereby leading to their inclusion in mainstream course content at the participating institutions.

Certification will be issued from the respective member country and evaluation and testing will be conducted in accordance with the appropriate regulatory agency. Ultimately, CIMET will adopt an international brand and will seek opportunities for training and certification in other countries. Key staff will be made available for the duration of the project, which will commence with a detailed study of the curricula and course structures of the EU and Canadian partner institutions. Courses will be amended and developed so as to make them homogeneous wherever practical. A total of 48 students (24 Canadian and 24 European) will get the opportunity to go on exchange.

CEMEC Canada-Europe: Mobilité Étudiante et Commerce

Seven business administration and international trade institutions are working in partnership to increase the mobility of students and interns and develop common training modules in cooperation with business partners. Member institutions, regions, and political and economic relations between the European Union and Atlantic Canada should benefit in the medium and long terms. Canadian and European partners will send, respectively, 63 and 72 students (135 in total) each year to partner institutions over the course of the project; students will observe European and Canadian organizational practices and cultures.

International Comparative Rural Policy Studies in Canada and the EU

This project aims to create a high-level, international, inter-disciplinary, and research-based learning environment for future leaders in rural policy development, research, teaching and practice. It will do so by developing a post-graduate program in comparative rural policy studies initially at six post-secondary educational institutions in Canada and the EU. The curriculum will include two intensive three-week summer schools attended by both EU and Canadian students. One summer school will be in the EU and one in Canada. The first takes place at the beginning of the students' 15-month program cycle, and the second at the end of it. It is expected that 28 Canadian and 28 European students will be involved in the summer school exchange courses over 3 years.

Canada-EU Consortium on Computer Networks and Networks Security Studies

The primary focus of the project for the consortia is to develop an international joint curriculum in the area of computer networks and network security for students of Canada and the European Union enrolled in degree programs. The key objectives of the project include the development of an infrastructure to promote virtual collaborative group projects and actual student mobility (about 72 undergrad students in total), language and cultural training and establishment and implementation of a credit transfer system among the partner institutions.

Centre for International Maritime Education and Training (CIMET)

The Centre for International Maritime Education and Training (CIMET) is a collaborative partnership between three institutions in Canada and three institutions in Europe. The program offered through this initiative provides students in the corresponding institutions the opportunity to study abroad in the areas of Nautical Science and Marine Engineering.

This program demonstrates the benefits that students can gain from studying abroad and how these individual gains can be worked into a procedure for the mutual recognition of accredited degrees in maritime studies in both Canada and the EU. Undergrade Students enrolled in a maritime related program will have an opportunity to gain international experience and learn from experts in the fields of Marine Engineering and Nautical Science through various courses and work terms. A minimum of 24 Canadian and 24 European students participate in the program. For faculty it is an opportunity to explore and develop different methods of instructions and to learn about the technologies being used at other institutions.

Erasmus Mundus

The Erasmus Mundus programme is a co-operation and mobility programme in the field of higher education. It aims to enhance quality in European higher education and to promote intercultural understanding through co-operation with third countries. The programme is intended to strengthen European co-operation and international links in higher education by supporting high-quality European Masters Courses, by enabling students and visiting scholars from around the world to engage in postgraduate study at European universities, as well as by encouraging the outgoing mobility of European students and scholars towards third countries.

The Erasmus Mundus programme comprises four concrete actions:

- **ACTION 1** - Erasmus Mundus Masters Courses: they constitute the central component around which Erasmus Mundus is built. They are high-quality integrated courses at masters level offered by a consortium of at least three universities in at least three different European countries. The courses must be "integrated" to be selected under Erasmus Mundus, which means that they must foresee a study period in at least two of the three universities and that it must lead to the award of a recognised double, multiple or joint diploma.
- **ACTION 2** - Erasmus Mundus scholarships: in order to give the Erasmus Mundus Masters Courses selected under Action 1 a strong external projection, a scholarship scheme for third-country graduate students and scholars from the whole world is linked to them. This scholarship scheme addresses highly qualified individuals who come to Europe to follow the Erasmus Mundus Masters Courses or to work for them.
- **ACTION 3** - Partnerships: in order to encourage European universities to open themselves up to the world and to reinforce their world-wide presence, Erasmus Mundus Masters Courses selected under Action 1 also have the possibility of establishing partnerships with third-country higher education institutions. These partnerships allow for outgoing mobility of graduate EU students and scholars involved in the Erasmus Mundus Masters Courses.
- **ACTION 4** - Enhancing attractiveness: Erasmus Mundus also supports projects aimed at enhancing the attractiveness of and the interest in European higher education. It supports activities that improve the profile, the visibility and the accessibility of European higher education as well as issues crucial to the internationalisation of higher education, such as the mutual recognition of qualifications with third countries.

Action 3 enables Institutions in non European Countries to participate as Partners in the Erasmus Mundus program. Currently two Canadian Universities are participating in Programs selected for the Erasmus Mundus program:

INTERNATIONAL ACADEMIC MOBILITY (IAM) INITIATIVE - ACTIVITIES AND BENEFITS

INCREASING STUDENT MOBILITY

Student mobility across borders is the cornerstone of the International Academic Mobility (IAM) initiative. That's because mobility - of both people and ideas - is essential to human resource development in today's global economy. The IAM programs offer Canadians, between 300 and 400 annually, their first international learning experiences. In addition to broadening their academic and cultural horizons, students also develop valuable international skills.

Study abroad experiences under IAM programs are fully credited to students' academic records, forming part of their degree or diploma programs. The focus on student mobility is leading to increased recognition and portability of academic credits in many post-secondary programs of study.

The IAM programs allow Canadian students to gain valuable international experience, including improved language abilities, better business and technology skills and increased understanding of foreign cultures. These skills help students to think globally, preparing them to make the most of their opportunities in a competitive international marketplace.

IAM student participants rate their study abroad experience as a very positive factor for potential employment. Prospective employers are impressed because it shows a willingness to adapt to new circumstances - an important quality much sought after in today's workplace. In cases where an employer has an export interest, students' international experience is directly useful, in terms of language skills and cultural understanding.

In addition to practical academic results and employment-related benefits, there is often an invaluable personal advantage to be gained from the experience of studying and living in another country. Students report that their exposure to different aspects of life and learning increases their maturity and self-confidence and better prepares them for life's challenges in general.

Student mobility is a two-way street, and Canada benefits from receiving international visitors. IAM projects increase the presence of foreign students on Canadian campuses throughout the country. This has positive economic, social and cultural impacts upon Canadian institutions and communities.

A focus on innovation and the use of new technologies under IAM projects enable 'non-mobile' students at Canadian universities and colleges to benefit from the international sharing of knowledge and ideas. The joint development of curriculum, courses and teaching materials with institutions of higher learning in other countries provides an important international perspective in what and how students learn.

ADVANCING INTERNATIONAL SKILLS AND KNOWLEDGE

The goal of the International Academic Mobility (IAM) programs is to contribute to Canada's economic growth and prosperity by helping Canadian students gain the international skills they need to compete in today's global economy. This is achieved through the movement and exchange of both students and knowledge across borders.

International skills allow young Canadians to find employment in a competitive and rapidly changing international marketplace and to excel in their chosen career fields. These skills include:

- cultural understanding and knowledge of diversity;
- resiliency and coping skills;
- a positive attitude toward change;
- advanced language skills;
- a capacity for discovering new or innovative ways to solve problems;
- flexibility and adaptability;
- an ability to work effectively with co-workers and in teams.

IAM experiences also enable Canadians to acquire valuable knowledge of the international community, contributing to a better understanding of global complexities and issues. This will enable future graduates to better seize upon emerging opportunities. Such knowledge and understanding includes:

- identifying and adopting best management practices;
- awareness and appreciation of negotiating techniques in different cultural settings;
- a knowledge of marketing opportunities in different cultural settings;
- the ability to gather and analyze market-related intelligence;
- an understanding of foreign business etiquette;
- the ability to access the best research and technologies available abroad;

Maximum HRSDC support for each project is up to \$200 000 under the Canada-EU Program, which is shared among the Canadian partner institutions.

TASSEP - Transatlantic Science Student Exchange Program

TASSEP is a consortium of member universities from the European Union, Canada and the United States. The lead universities are the University of Aarhus, the University of North Carolina, and Waterloo University in Canada. The key feature in TASSEP is strong academic advising by science faculty, who work in close cooperation with their study abroad offices. This ensures that students are properly advised about course selection and eases the problems of receiving credit for courses taken abroad. The goal is to permit students to take most of their normal junior level courses abroad and still be able to graduate on time. New members can be added to TASSEP by mutual consent of the three lead universities in consultation with all of the member universities.

Purpose and Goals

As scientific activities, both in private industry as well as university and government laboratories, become increasingly international in scope, it is essential that science students become familiar with foreign cultures, languages, and economic systems. One of the most effective vehicles for addressing this problem is through exchange programs in which students spend a year abroad, living much like the students at the foreign university. The goal of the present program is to facilitate these opportunities for science students. Science students face unique problems because of the large number of required courses in the standard four or five year curriculum, and because of the vertical structure of the science curriculum.

The TASSEP exchange program for science students is a vehicle that permits students to study their chosen discipline at a foreign university. The agreement insures that students receive full credit for courses taken at the foreign university. Students pay tuition and fees at their home institution and thereby receive student status at the foreign university. The exchange program is based on 1:1 reciprocity in which one foreign student replaces a student from the home institution. Each institution retains control of student selection as well as the number of students that participate in the program. The program is limited to students enrolled in the participating universities.

Program Costs

Students pay tuition in their home institution and can enroll in the foreign university with no additional costs.

Eligibility:

Undergraduate students enrolled in a science student at one of the participating institutions.

Language Requirements

It is expected that a student attending a non-English speaking university, will have had at least 2 college years of training in that language. (Exceptions can be made in consultation with the foreign university advisor) Most of the non-English speaking universities offer intensive language programs during a 3-4 week prior to the beginning of the academic year.

Courses and Grades (ECTS System)

Each student's course enrollment is decided by prior agreement between the student, his or her advisor, and the foreign university representative or coordinator. This agreement, signed by the three parties, then serves as a guarantee that satisfactory

completion of the course work will count toward fulfillment of the home institution graduation requirements.

The North2north Mobility Program of the University of the Arctic

The **north2north** is consortium based student exchange program exclusively for students of the North, studying the North.

Created with this special focus in mind, the **north2north** program

- Involves institutions in the circumpolar North
- Is focused on northern studies
- Enhances the students' Arctic perspective
- Gives students valuable and relevant experience
- Creates new friendships
- Counts toward the degree

The **north2north** program is organized by the University of the Arctic, an international network of educational institutions dedicated to providing relevant and accessible post-secondary education to the people of the North. A limited number of its member institutions are participating in the current pilot phase of the program. Students at one of these institutions may apply for an exchange at a participating institution in another circumpolar country. (see below)

North2north participants travel to another circumpolar institution for a period of 3-12 months. This time period is dependent on individual needs and the structures of the home and host institutions. Students have the advantage of taking courses that may not be available back home and which can be taken credited toward the degree. The language of study varies between institutions and study programs. Students will receive some language preparation as part of their participation in the north2north program.

Eligibility

To be eligible for the north2north program, students must be registered at one of the participating institutions. The north2north program is designed for undergrad students whose studies are relevant to the North. **First priority is given to students who:**

- are studying in UArctic program, such as the Bachelor of Circumpolar Studies, OR
- are studying in another program with a strong northern emphasis, OR
- can demonstrate how their academic goals can contribute meaningfully to the Arctic region
- are dedicated to contributing to your northern community and the Arctic region generally
- **north2north makes special efforts to include indigenous students and students from smaller northern communities**

Financial support:

Successful applicants will receive a mobility grant to facilitate their stay at the host institution.

- Travel grant to all countries for Canadian student: \$3 000 CAN
- Living grant for 3 - 4 months: \$1 200 - \$1 600 CAN
- Living grant for 5 - 12 months: \$2 000 - \$4 800 CAN

The program enables about 17 Austrian students each year to do an international Masters degree taught in English by teaching staff of the UBC Sauders Business School. Students apply directly to UBC or through Donau University.

Seventeen of the 20 modules that the students take will be offered at Donau University in Krems. Three modules will be offered in Vancouver each July. These are offered on a full-time basis over three weeks.

Admission Requirements

- A four-year Bachelor's degree or recognized equivalent from an accredited institution
- Fluency in English
- Sufficient undergraduate background to carry out graduate work in a chosen field

Fees and Tuitions

The application fee is \$125 CAD. The tuition is \$33,000 CAD for the cooperative UBC-Donau University Program (does not include costs for books, case materials and supplies or the costs for the stay in Canada and Austria). For participants who do not finish the program schedule, an additional fee of \$2,500 (no VAT) will be charged. The unfinished module(s) may be completed during the next program schedule.

Note: An imbalance exists in many of these exchanges. In the cases of Freiburg, Berlin and Bonn, UBC is in a net positive position, sending more students than it receives. With Augsburg, Köln, Siegen and particularly Würzburg, however, the German institutions send more students than UBC does. Also, the MBA exchange with WHU Koblenz is also underutilized as students seem to view Germany as a destination less beneficial to their future careers than others.

Canada Year in Freiburg Program

Trent, Acadia and Brock Universities and the University of British Columbia and Manitoba are members of the Canada Year in Freiburg Program, an arrangement which makes it possible for 7 students from each of the participating schools to study at the Albert-Ludwigs-Universität Freiburg for one full academic year.

Participants with sufficient German skills upon arrival in Freiburg may take a regular course load, while those with only minimal fluency take German courses for their first semester and pursue regular courses in their second term.

The Canadian students receive part of their instruction from the program's Resident Director, a faculty member of one of the four participating Canadian institutions who is also available to help students during their time abroad.

While abroad, students pay their regular tuition to their home institutions. Participation is not limited to students of the four member schools, but applicants from other Canadian universities advised that a letter of permission from one of the four member schools is required.

Please note: University of British Columbia has big number of exchange and study abroad partners around the world. Each year about 550 UBC-students go abroad to study in a foreign country, approximately half of which choose to study in a European Union member state.

These programs vary from a short summer field study to a one term or one year stay abroad, often involving the same partner institutions in Europe. Therefore and for the high number of exchanges, it was not possible for the international office to give detailed numbers of vacancies for the different programs.

Eligibility

To be eligible for any exchange program, students must have obtained a 70% average. Arts students are eligible to go at any point after completing their first year. Other students must have at least 3rd year standing at the time of the exchange.

Application fee \$325

Financial Assistance

UBC's Go Global Office for Student Mobility offers scholarships ranging from \$500 to \$750 per term (amount varies each year) to students who have obtained at least a 75% during the year prior to exchange. They must have been enrolled in at least 27 credits to be eligible. As exchange students, they also maintain their UBC status which means that they are eligible for student loans and bursaries. Tuition is paid to UBC and not the partner university and students are required to pay for a full course load (15 credits per term).

MBA Exchange Program of Saunders Business School

MBA students with a minimum 70% average are eligible to apply to participate in the exchange program. Students following the International Business (IB) sub-specialization must participate in the exchange program to fulfill the IB requirements.

Fees:

Students are responsible for all travel costs, accommodation, books, personal expenses and orientation fees. UBC Scholarships are available for students participating in an exchange program who have a strong academic standing during the academic year prior to the exchange program, with no failed courses.

Eligibility

- a minimum of 36 credit hours completed (of which a minimum of 12 must have been completed at SFU)

Fees:

Each exchange student must also pay a non-refundable Exchange Participation Fee of \$150.

Financial support:

Students selected to participate in an exchange program remain registered at SFU while they study abroad and remain eligible for local scholarships, awards, and financial assistance.

Numbers: Every agreement includes 2 spots for outgoing and incoming students each, but total numbers vary on demand. Altogether SFU is sending about 150 students abroad every year, to all destinations. Detailed numbers can not be giving because of the high number of programs.

Field Schools Programs

A Field School is a group study tour for a group of 12 - 20 students. Each Field School is a full semester program, directed by an SFU instructor, consisting of 9 to 12 credit hours of selected courses delivered through coursework, assignments, and field studies beginning at an SFU campus then traveling overseas to one or more locations. Tuition, shared accommodation, basic health insurance, field excursions and, in most cases return airfares to Vancouver are included in the cost of the Field School. A study tour is a regular SFU course which incorporates a mandatory international field trip.

Eligibility

Applicants must be 19 years of age or older prior to departure, have completed a minimum of 30 credit hours of university courses and be in good academic standing. The basic cost quotation includes: in-country shared accommodation, basic travel health insurance, field excursions, return airfare from Vancouver (unless otherwise noted), single entry visas, if required, pre-departure and re-entry orientations.

Financial Assistance

Student International Mobility Fund (SIMF)

The **Student International Mobility Fund (SIMF)** has been developed to support international professional development opportunities for SFU undergraduate students which contribute to the internationalization of the SFU Community. Funding has been identified to assist with travel, participation and living costs for individual students engaged in international seminars, symposia (such as WUSC, United Nations), conferences and internships.

The SIMF does not provide funding for international exchange, field school or paid co-op placements. SFU International has supported the creation of scholarship and awards funding for outbound domestic students involved in exchanges, field schools and co-op

placements; funds earmarked for these purposes can be accessed through the Office of Financial Aid and Awards in the Dean of Students portfolio. Additionally, bursary support is available to the international student population through the same office.

Funding and Terms

The SIMF has set aside funds on an annual basis to assist in supporting a limited number of non-credit, undergraduate student international mobility opportunities, with preference given to students in their final year of studies. There are fixed funds available each semester, up to a maximum of \$500 per proposal, for the following:

- Seminars, symposia, and conferences: to assist with economy air travel, transportation, seminar/symposia/conference fees, accommodation and living costs.
- Internships/volunteer/unpaid Co-op placements: to assist with economy air travel, transportation, seminar/symposia/conference fees, accommodation and living costs for placements of a minimum of 4 weeks.

If required, personal funding can be used or additional financial support sought through other university and external resources.

Selection

Up to four proposals per semester will be funded contingent upon funding. Strong consideration will be given to those proposals that include a focus on international related activities which offer professional development for the individual. A selection committee will deliberate on the proposals; successful applicants will be notified by SFU International.

Financial Support: Student International Activities Fund (SIAF)

The University has just established the Student International Activities Fund (SIAF) to assist UVic students in participating in international activities, including participation in international exchange programs organized by UVic.

The maximum grant available from the fund is \$500 and it must be used to offset travel, accommodation, or living expenses associated with the international activity. The fund is limited and the grant application process is competitive. Selection criteria include merit (the activity's “fit” with both the student's academic program and the objectives of the SIAF program) and demonstrated financial need. Students must exhaust other sources of funding before being considered for a grant under the SIAF Program.

Faculty of Business

Eligibility requirements

- Completion of 300 level core
- Minimum GPA of 4.0 in all academic terms following admission to the Faculty of Business
- 3 UVic units of a foreign language are strongly recommended. Students who have completed the language requirement will have priority in exchange placements

Fees/ Tuition

Tuition (for 7.5 units) to UVic and a \$300 INTEX Program fee, \$150 of which is refunded when student has arrived at destination and provided the IP office with a completed Student Data Sheet, a Student Responsibility Form and a Course Approval Form.

Scholarships

Scholarships of \$850 will be available to support students going on exchange to the following universities in summer or fall 2006, or January 2007.

- Jonkoping International Business School, Sweden
- University Maastricht, The Netherlands
- HHL Leipzig Graduate School of Management, Germany
- University of Mannheim, Germany

Where there are more students applying than scholarships available, scholarships will be awarded based on highest GPA and overall strength of applicant. Minimum GPA to qualify for a scholarship is normally 6.0.

Please Note: The Faculty of Business usually has about 4 placements per Partner University in Europe. In reality about 35 students go to European Destinations each year, which means that usually most placements are filled.

The cooperation with France, Hungary and Sweden is based on a reciprocal exchange agreement. Each academic year, two students are sent to France and Hungary, and five to Sweden.

Eligibility:

Undergraduate students in their second year can participate in the exchange programs. Students must be rolled in a full-time program, be in good academic standing (minimum C+ cumulative average on their academic record in the semester preceding your semester abroad), and complete a year of study at Camosun College. Where the language of instruction at a partner institution is not English, they must have reading, writing and speaking proficiencies in the relevant language in order to undertake courses on the exchange.

Field school participants must be nineteen or older before departure and be in good academic standing. Students under nineteen require permission of their parent/guardian. Qualified students from institutions other than Camosun College are eligible to participate, however, after gaining admission to Camosun College as Visiting Students.

Fees:

Students pay tuition and fees to Camosun College. They are also responsible for the cost of their housing and meals (unless agreement specifies differently), as well as for all transportation, travel, medical and living expenses.

The Cost of the field school is \$ 4200 and it includes: airfare; accommodation with local families; two meals per day; program operational costs; tuition and local program fees; emergency medical kits; and local field trips and excursions.

Financial assistance:

Students eligible for a student loan will maintain the status while on exchange as a registered Camosun College student. Field school participants can apply for funding from the College.

Please note: The majority of the agreements are either student exchange or student mobility agreements. The exchange agreements are generally made for a three-year duration and then renewed if both institutions are agreeable. The mobility agreements are externally funded so each one is dependant on the guidelines of the funding agency (CIDA, ACCC, HRSDC), but normally three to five years.

Eligibility:

Students usually participate in exchange programs in their third or fourth year. They must be in good academic standing (B average); provide a statement of interest; resume; two letters of reference; and attend an interview. Some of the programs offer the University Transfer Credit (UT). The exchanges for UT students are offered in their second year. In the case of programs where English is not the language of instruction, language proficiency of the host country is required.

Fees:

Exchange program students pay tuition fees to Capilano College. They are responsible for their airfare, accommodation, living expenses and textbooks at the host institution. Students on exchange also pay an addition \$45 per credit to defray the administrative costs of running the student abroad/exchange programs. No additional tuition is paid to the partner institution.

In the case of the Denmark’s International Program, the eight weeks option gives 30% discount on tuition fees.

Financial assistance:

Capilano College offers a transportation subsidy of up to \$ 1 000 to all students embarking on an international exchange. This normally works out to about \$750 each towards the cost of their airfare. Students participating in an international mobility program receive a stipend as part of the project.

In the case of the Denmark’s International Program, two scholarships are available: \$ 1 000 US for the short-term and \$ 3 000 US for the one-term program.

Hungary

Budapest Semesters in Mathematics

1. For Third and Fourth Year Undergrad Students

Duration: One or two semesters

Hungary has a long tradition of excellence in mathematics education. Initiated by Paul Erdos, Laszlo Lovasz and Vera T. Sos, Budapest Seminars in Mathematics is a program for North American undergraduates whereby mathematics and computer science majors in their 3rd or 4th years may spend one or two semesters in Budapest and study, in English, under the tutelage of eminent Hungarian scholar-teachers. Most instructors have had North American teaching experience, classes are small, credits are transferable and living costs are modest. Semesters start the first week of September and February.

2. Graduate Students

Central European University (CEU) Budapest, Hungary, an institution of higher education in the social sciences and the humanities, has now introduced a new PhD program in mathematics, in cooperation with the Alfred Renyi Institute of Mathematics in Budapest. The Institute was founded by the Hungarian Academy of Sciences in 1949 and the research staff consists of about 70 members. It is located in a small turn-of-the-century palace in the very center of Budapest.

A Doctoral Support Program in Mathematics is available to students enrolled in full-time doctoral studies at recognized institutions of higher education. DSP students will receive consultation and supervision from the CEU and the Institute's faculty. There is no requirement to earn course credit; participants are encouraged to work together with the faculty of the program. Therefore, the program will be most beneficial to students who are at the stage of thesis writing.

Antje Graupe Pryor International Awards in Engineering scholarship

Second- or third-year undergraduate Engineering students at UC wishing to study for one or two semesters at a university in Germany or France may apply for the Antje Graupe Pryor International Awards in Engineering scholarship. This award has a value of \$7500 for one semester of foreign study, and four semester prizes are granted each year with a maximum of 2 semesters to be received by any one student. (Please note that this award is reciprocal meaning for every UC recipient, a student from the European institution also receives the same financial recognition.)

International Studentship Awards

The Associates Program of the International Centre, the International Student Centre, the Asian Studies Group, the Faculty of Law, and the law firm of Macleod Dixon LLP announce the offering of International Studentship Awards. Successful applicants will receive minimum awards of \$500. Larger Awards may be available to law students. Engineering Summer Study Abroad Program

The study abroad program consists of 14 days in Italy and 24 days in France, 10 of which are 'class days'. The 'class days' include two hours of lecture per class. The other non-class days involve field trips and sight seeing. Two days are completely free, leaving the students to do as they please. A five day field trip to north-western France is also included. Students are required to enroll in 2 classes (6 credits total), all of which are transferable back to the U of S for an Engineering Undergraduate degree. Courses will be taught by Nebraska State University and U of S Profs. It is open to 15 U of S students in all disciplines of engineering. These students will be joining approximately 40 Texas A & M Engineering students. While studying overseas, students receive lectured material, as well as many hands-on experiences.

Program Costs:

- \$3 200 USD Program Fee (including accommodations, transportation, meals, entrance fees on all field trips, textbooks)

Work Opportunities: Opportunities for student work are also available while overseas during the study abroad program for approx. 20% of the students. Each work term position pays approximately \$500 USD and requires about 15 hours of work effort per week. Canada Year in Freiburg Program

Trent, Acadia, Brock Universities and the Universities of British Columbia and Manitoba are members of the Canada Year in Freiburg Program, an arrangement which makes it possible for 7 students from each of the participating schools to study at the Albert-Ludwigs-Universität Freiburg for one full academic year.

Participants with sufficient German skills upon arrival in Freiburg may take a regular course load, while those with only minimal fluency take German courses for their first semester and pursue regular courses in their second term.

The Canadian students receive part of their instruction from the program's Resident Director, a faculty member of one of the four participating Canadian institutions who is also available to help students during their time abroad.

While abroad, students pay their regular tuition to their home institutions. Participation is not limited to students of the four member schools, but applicants

Up to 25 qualified students will be admitted to the biennial Third-Year Abroad Program in French Studies, held from October to June at the Université de Perpignan. The group will be accompanied by Professor Joseph Nnadi from The University of Winnipeg. In addition to taking 20.3001/6 Civilization of France and 20.3002/6 Principles of Writing, students can also take an optional Special Topics course with Professor Nnadi, and courses with Université de Perpignan faculty in various aspects of French language, linguistics and literature. Excursions to historical and cultural sites will be organized as part of 20.3001/6 Civilization of France.

Eligibility

Students preparing the BA (General) or BA (Honours) in French Studies or the B. Ed., or those wishing to pursue studies in French are eligible to apply. Students from other universities may also apply.

The program is intended for students who, by the end of the 2004-2005 academic year, will have taken: 20.2109/3 Normative Grammar, 20.2110/3 Intermediate Written Expression, and a second-year French Studies literature course (preferred) or 20.1381/6 Introduction to Francophone Literature, or the equivalent of these required courses.

Dr. Douglas W. Leatherdale Global Internships

The Dr. Douglas W. Leatherdale Global Internships were established in 2005 as a result of a generous gift made to The University of Winnipeg Global College by Dr. Douglas W. Leatherdale, a 1957 graduate of United College and a 2003 Honourary Degree recipient of The University of Winnipeg. The Internships are designed to support students who wish to augment their degree programs with credits they obtain through international studies in Human Rights and Global Studies, Health, Security, and Human Potential, or Climate Studies - the areas represented by the Global College Institutes. The Internships are available to University of Winnipeg students wishing to study abroad and also are available to international students wishing to pursue their studies at the University of Winnipeg. The Internships will be granted for study periods of 6 weeks to 3 months.

Should recipients wish to participate in an international practicum or work placement, arrangements must be made with a University of Winnipeg academic department to grant degree credit for the practicum.

Eligibility

Applicants must satisfy the following criteria:

- Satisfactory academic performance (normally, a B average or higher; GPA: 3.00).
- Demonstrated commitment to the community
- Demonstrated leadership qualities.
- Successful completion of at least 30 credit hours in pursuit of an undergraduate degree. Normally, recipients will be in the second or third year of a 4-year or Honours degree program.
- Pursuit of one of the focus areas of the Global College Institutes.
- Proposed program of study in international institution must be for university credit.

Financial Support: Internships will be awarded annually with a maximum value of \$5 000.

Other Study Abroad Opportunities:

University of Winnipeg students may choose to study at another university by taking one or more courses as a visiting student. In this case, they will pay tuition fees to that university. In addition, a "Letter of Permission" is required which ensures that the courses taken will be recognized for transfer credit at U of W.

Brandon University

Brandon University's Faculty of Education conducts a practicum program in exchange with the University of Wales, Newport. With this program each year in March up to six Brandon students visit the University of Wales for eight weeks (six weeks teaching and a two weeks break) to attend their final teaching placement abroad. They get credit at their home University and while being supervised at their host University. In

exchange up to five students from Wales visit Brandon University under the same conditions.

Costs: Students have to cope their travel and living expenses themselves.

The Ontario-Baden-Württemberg / Ontario-Rhône-Apes Exchange Program is a consortium of sixteen publicly-funded Ontario universities and the publicly-funded universities of the German state of Baden Württemberg as well as the French region Rhône-Apes. The program enables undergraduate and graduate students to pursue part of their studies, typically one school year, at one of the German or French partner institutions, and vice versa.

Each year the Program sends approximately 200 students from all the three regions abroad, to study at one of the Partner Institutions on the other side of the Atlantic. The aim of the program is a balanced activity in all directions, which means that approximately 50 students would study abroad each year for each combination of partners (ON → BW, BW → ON, ON → RA, RA → ON).

Department of Classics: Brock University Archaeological Practicum

Summer 2006 - July 15 to August 15

The Brock University Archaeological Practicum (or field school) is designed to introduce students in a systematic and formal fashion to the basic skills and techniques of excavation, horizontal and vertical measurement, drawing plans and sections, recording of archaeological data, and trench notebook maintenance. The participants do the digging themselves with some help with heavy tasks from local workmen. The goal of the Practicum is to train participants in a hands-on fashion so that they will be qualified to work on other projects as effective and knowledgeable excavators with a minimum of supervision. The Field School takes place at Priniatikos Pyrgos in eastern Crete. This program is a full credit undergraduate course. Students are accompanied by three teaching assistants and the instructor for this course is Dr. R. Angus Smith.

Dates: July 15th to August 15th.

Numbers of spots: open to up to 20 students

Fees

The fee for CLAS 4F75 will be \$3 000. Included in the cost of the fee will be: field trip transportation and museum/site entrances; room; partial board (breakfast and lunch on work days); some excavation equipment and supplies; welcome and farewell dinners; access to the INSTAP-SCEC library resources.

Tuition, one credit hour, is separate from this fee. Students may also apply for bursaries.

n.b.: The following expenses are **not** included in the above fees: transatlantic airfare; partial board - dinners and weekend meals; all expenses of a personal nature; all local travel of a personal nature. The accommodations include kitchens. Food costs are approximately the same as in Canada.

Students must register with, and pay the fees to the University of Guelph and they will receive credit for their courses from this university.

Please note: Due to the high number of agreements it was not possible to provide individual Numbers of placements for all the programs. In the beginning agreements are usually signed for 2-4 students per year. However U of Ottawa’s International Office is very active in increasing the number of exchanges students over the years (see for example the exchange program with Granada, Spain). Numbers depend on student’s interest and favorite European destinations are France, United Kingdom and Spain.

Eligibility criteria:

- be a Canadian citizen, a permanent resident or an international student admitted to a regular **undergraduate or graduate** program and registered **full-time at the time of the exchange**. Students registered in the Co-operative Education Programs (CO-OP Programs) are eligible;
- have completed at least one year* of university studies or the equivalent (24 credits completed on or before March 1, 2006). Students registered in the English or French Common Law Program can submit an application during their first year of study;
- obtain an assessment of their academic record from the academic administrator of their faculty, department, section or school;
- have a minimum cumulative grade point average (CGPA) of B (6); Civil Law and Common Law students may apply with a CGPA of C+ (5) on March 1, 2006 and maintain it until leaving for the exchange;
- have command of the official language of the host institution (proof of language proficiency required - two years of study or the equivalent);

Costs: \$50 participation fee

Financial Support

Student Mobility Scholarship

The University of Ottawa, namely the Student Mobility Fund and the faculties, offer mobility scholarships to all students selected to take part in an exchange program. Please note that the Faculty of Arts offers its contribution, which represents half of

the amount of the scholarship, to students who have a cumulative grade point average of 7.5 and more on March 1, 2006.

Students who take part in an international exchange receive a scholarship of \$1 000 for a four-month participation or \$2 000 for a six- or eight-month participation.

Students who take part in a national exchange receive a scholarship of \$500 for a four-month participation or \$1 000 for an eight-month participation.

Half of the amount of the scholarship is deposited in the student's bank account at the end of August or at the beginning of December, depending on the departure date for the host institution. The other half of the scholarship is deposited upon the return of the student after receiving the official transcript or an official document from the host institution as well as the questionnaire. If the student cancels his or her participation in the exchange, he or she must reimburse the scholarship either entirely or partially within 30 days depending on the reasons.

Only one exchange position is available each year and all Faculties compete for the Scholarship. *** Please note:** Exchange agreements at the Queen’s School of Business are usually signed including 4 students per year. Arts and Science

Students participating in the Faculty's exchange program spend their **third year** at one of the partner universities, but pay normal tuition and ancillary fees to Queen's. All **second year** Arts & Science students are eligible to apply to the Faculty's exchange program, on condition that they return to Queen's to complete their honours year. Normally, a good B average (70-75%) in first year is required to be considered for most of our exchanges.

Faculty of Law:

- academic appropriateness
- fluency in language of host institution
- quality of written documentation, letters of reference
- prior participation in an exchange.

Queen's International Study Centre (ISC) at Herstmonceux

Beginning in the Fall of 1994, Queen's offered a selection of courses at the newly opened [International Study Centre](#) at Herstmonceux Castle in the south of England. This facility was given to Queen's by an Applied Science alumnus, Alfred Bader, and provides unusual opportunities to combine Canadian education with a superb European experience.

There are three different kinds of programs offered at the ISC:

- First year program: students spend you entire first year at Herstmonceux Castle
- With the Upper year program students spend a year or a term of their undergraduate program at Herstmonceux Castle
- International Law Program: law school students spend Spring Term of their LL.B. or J.D. program at Herstmonceux Castle

Description

1. First-Year Program

The First-Year Program "Canadian University Study Abroad Program" (CUSAP) is only available to first-year students of the following universities:

- Queen's University
- The University of Victoria
- The University of British Columbia
- Huron University College
- McGill University
- Dalhousie University

First-Year Program students spend one academic year (September to April) living and studying at the International Study Centre (ISC) in East Sussex, England. They have to be admitted through one of the six universities listed above, spend your first year at the ISC, and then return to the university to which they were admitted for the rest of their undergraduate degree. All courses are Queen's University degree credit courses and will be accepted as a first-year course load. The First-Year Program includes high-level classroom work, field studies in England and Europe, and cultural study trips and excursions.

Course Offerings:

Art History, Astronomy, British Studies, Classical Studies, Commerce, Drama, Economics, Effective Writing, English Literature, Film Studies, Fine Art, French, Geography, German, History, Intercultural Studies, International Studies, Mathematics, Music, Philosophy, Political Studies, Psychology, Religious Studies, Spanish

Total Program Fee: \$24 990 (2006/2007), including:

- Tuition: five full-year course equivalents
- Field study trips: transportation, entrance fees and lunches, as well as accommodation and breakfast on overnight excursions
- Room and board: shared accommodation (2 students per room) and full meal plan

- Access to all ISC facilities and services including computing rooms, library, and fully equipped sports room
 - Regular trips to the libraries (and borrowing privileges) at the University of Sussex
 - Regular banking/shopping trips to nearby towns
 - Transfers: transportation from and to Heathrow airport on designated days
- Number of spots:** 140 placements, of which about 85-90 are usually filled with Queen's students. The other placements go to the other CUSAP member institutions, based on demand.

2. Upper-Year Program

The ISC Upper-Year Program is open to all students at a CUSAP partner institution as well as qualified students from colleges and universities around the world, who have completed at least one year of university. The program consists of internationally-focused Queen's accredited courses, field studies and site visits across the U.K. and Europe.

Students may attend the ISC for one or more of four Upper-Year terms to take university-accredited courses:

Fall Term: September to December

Winter Term: January to April

Spring Term: May to mid-June

Summer Term: mid-June to mid-July

Fall and Winter terms provide five term-length courses (equal to 2.5 credits), Spring Term provides three term-length courses (1.5 credits), Summer Term provides two term-length courses (1.0 credits)

Number of spots: In fall and winter, the capacity of the ISC allows 40 additional placements for upper year undergrad students. In the spring (6 weeks) and summer (4 weeks) term all 180 placements are free for the upper year program and the law program (8 weeks).

3. Law Program

Eligibility:

Students enrolled in an LL.B. or J.D. program at an accredited Canadian university
Two modules (Public International Law and International Business Law) are offered, and take place during May and June of each year.

International Law Program Fee: \$9 500

Your International Law Program Fees include:

- Tuition: Three half-year credits
- Room and board: shared accommodation (2 students per room) and full meal plan
- Field study trips: transportation, entrance fees and lunches, as well as accommodation and breakfast on overnight excursions
- Access to all ISC facilities and services including computing rooms, library, sports room and equipment
- Regular trips to the libraries (and borrowing privileges) at the University of Sussex
- Regular banking/shopping trips to nearby towns
- Transfers: transportation from and to Heathrow airport on designated days

Number of spots: In fall and winter, the capacity of the ISC allows 40 additional placements for upper year undergrad students. In the spring (6 weeks) and summer (4 weeks) term all 180 placements are free for the upper year program and the law program (8 weeks).

Financial Assistance for the ISC Program

Queen's ISC bursaries normally range in value to more approximately half the ISC program fees. These awards and bursaries are available for students in either the First-Year Program or the Upper-Year Program. Queen's students participating in an exchange may also apply for a Queen's General Bursary.

First-Year Program

The following award is available to those students who pursue a degree program at Queen's University and who also undertake their first year of study at the International Study Centre at Herstmonceux:

- **Tricolour Bursary - First-Year Program**
Established by Queen's University and awarded on the basis of financial need and academic merit to Queen's students studying at the International Study Centre. For Queen's students enrolled in the International Study Centre - First-Year Program, bursaries range in value up to \$9 000.

Upper-Year Program

Awards and bursaries are available to students choosing to attend the ISC in their second or subsequent years. Queen's ISC upper year bursaries normally range in value, up to more than half of the ISC program fees.

The objective of the bursary program is to assist students who demonstrate a financial need by meeting a portion of their basic costs of attending the International Study Centre with non-repayable financial assistance grants.

Awards Open to ALL Students

The following awards are open to all upper-year students who wish to attend the International Study Centre at Herstmonceux. Students should also contact their home university's financial aid office for other possible sources of funding.

- **Tricolour Bursary - Upper-Year**
Established by Queen's University and awarded on the basis of financial need and academic merit to an upper-year student studying at the International Study Centre.
- **The Alfred Bader International Study Award**
Established by Alfred Bader and awarded on the basis of academic merit and financial need to student(s) for study at the International Study Centre.
- **Claire L. Leggett International Study Award**
Established by Claire Leggett and awarded on the basis of demonstrated financial need to undergraduate students studying on a formal Queen's Exchange or studying at the International Study Centre.
- **The John Greer Nicholson ISC Award**
Awarded on the basis of financial need to a student studying at the International Study Centre.
- **The Kathleen Ryan International Study Centre Award**
Established by a bequest from Kathleen Ryan, B.A. 1926, and awarded on the basis of financial need and academic excellence to upper-year students for study at the International Study Centre.

Awards available to students pursuing a degree at Queen's University

- **The Blakely Family International Study Award**
Established by Robert Blakely, LL.B. 1973 and Cindy Blakely. Awarded on the basis of financial need and academic excellence to two upper-year, full-time undergraduate students in the Faculty of Arts and Science. Preference is given to students in the Department of Sociology. One award will be directed to a student studying at the International Study Centre and students apply on the ISC bursary application form available from the Student Awards office. The second award will be directed to a student participating in a Queen's official exchange program.
- **The Harold and Helen Cave Scholarship**
Established by a bequest from the estate of Professor Harold M. Cave of Queen's University who, together with his wife, Helen, studied in the Department of Art during their post-retirement years. Awarded to a Queen's art history student with high academic standing in the previous year who is enrolled in an art history course at the Queen's International Study Centre at Herstmonceux Castle which will count toward his/her program. If no suitable candidate is identified, the scholarship will be awarded to a similarly qualified Queen's student taking a course in the Queen's Venice Summer School. Awarded in the fall or winter term.
- **The Stephen Csatari Memorial Award**
Established in October 2002 by family, friends and fellow students in memory of Stephen Csatari a third year honours History student at the International Study Centre in 2002, who died suddenly of a rare and undetected heart defect, and

awarded on the basis of financial need and academic achievement to upper year students in the Faculty of Arts and Science, with a major or medial in History, who are enrolled in History courses at the International Study Centre. If there are no eligible candidates, the award could be granted to students in any program at the International Study Centre.

- **The Donald C. and Cornelia N. Elliott Award**
Established by Donald C. Elliott and Cornelia N. Elliott. Donald C. Elliott was a member of the Board of Trustees of Queen's University from 1985 to 2000, and Chairman of the Board from 1995 to 2000. Awarded to any student in any year in any program on the basis of financial need and academic excellence. Preference will be given to (1) student enrolled at the International Study Centre in England or any comparable successor program, or, if there are no eligible students to (2) students in the departments of Fine Art and Music.
- **The International Study Centre Bursary**
Awarded on the basis of financial need to students studying at the International Study Centre.
- **The International Study Award**
Awarded on the basis of financial need to students studying at the International Study Centre. Application should be made on the International Study Centre Bursary Application form and should be submitted to the Associate University Registrar (Student Awards) prior to departure.
- **The Franklin G.T. Pickard Memorial International Award**
Established by Audrey Pickard, Barbara Pickard and Beverly Pickard in memory of Franklin G.T. Pickard, B.A. 1957, Honorary Doctor of Business Administration, Laurentian University, 1996, for his forty years of active support and promotion of Queen's University. Awarded on the basis of financial need and academic excellence to enable Queen's students to participate in a period of study at the International Study Centre.
- **The Sutton International Study Award**
Established by Gerald D. Sutton, B.Com.'48, M.Com.'49 and Margaret (Scally) Sutton, B.A.(Hon)'48 in order to foster a greater understanding of global issues. Awarded on the basis of financial need to an outstanding student(s) in the graduate or undergraduate program in the School of Business to enable study abroad. In the case of a graduate student, the funds are available for research study abroad while the student is enrolled in a graduate program in the School of Business at Queen's University. In the case of an undergraduate student, the funds are available for an international exchange program or a term(s) at the Queen's International Study Centre at Herstmonceux.
- **The Allan R. Taylor International Study Award**
Established by Allan R. Taylor and awarded to a Queen's student for a term of study at the International Study Centre at Herstmonceux. The winners of this award will have demonstrated financial need, academic excellence, and an interest in contributing to Canadians' understanding of international issues and opportunities.

Ryerson University differentiates between two kinds of exchanges: university wide and School/Faculty Specific Exchanges. The first ones (marked above with an ‘^’) are agreements on university wide level, however they are often restricted to certain areas of study and eventually planned to be enlarged to new areas. The School/Faculty Specific Exchanges are agreements on the level of individual schools or faculties.

Because of the high number of programs, it was not possible to provide individual placement numbers for all exchanges. Usually university wide exchanges offer between 10 and 12 spots for Ryerson students and the School/Faculty exchanges between 3 to 5.

Financial Support

Scotiabank international mobility Awards

The **Ryerson University Scotiabank International Mobility Award** is a competitive program that provides funds to assist both full-time and part-time Ryerson students to participate in approved *outbound* international student exchange programs or other approved international experiences (e.g. field camp, practicum, etc.). Established through a generous gift from **Scotiabank**, the program seeks to expand opportunities for student involvement in international activities that enhance awareness and understanding of different peoples and cultures.

There are two types of awards:

“A” Awards: For study/placements extending from 3 weeks (minimum) to one semester

Value: \$500

“B” Awards: For study/placements of two semesters (one full academic year)

Value \$1 000

Eligibility:

In order to be considered for these awards, a student must:

- Be a Canadian citizen or landed immigrant
- Have completed the equivalent of at least one full year of study at Ryerson (i.e. ten one semester courses, or equivalent)
- Have a cumulative grade point average (GPA) of at least 3.00, and clear academic standing
- Be participating in a program approved by the school or department, for which the student will receive academic credit or which fulfills, in whole or in part, an academic requirement. This will include Letter of Permission opportunities.
- The application must be completed **IN FULL** to be considered. If information is missing, the application will be rejected.

Faculty of Communication and Design (FCAD)- Travel Bursary

Study Abroad Program at Nantes

About the Nantes Program and Courses

The Nantes Program is a "transplant-type" program administered by the International Student Exchange Office (ISXO) in cooperation with the Department of French. Unlike what happens in other study elsewhere opportunities, students at Nantes actually enroll in UofT Arts and Science courses while they are away, earning regular credits (including grades).

Students participating in the Nantes program have access to five UofT courses, two taught by the Canadian Resident Director and three by French professors from the senior teaching staff of the Université de Nantes. Courses cover topics in French history, literature, language, culture and philosophy.

Students may also enroll in courses offered in the "Programmes réguliers" at the Université de Nantes. These courses (in all disciplines/departments) are for French students and open to foreign students whose competence in the French language is up to the challenge. However, UofT students who take these courses must apply for transfer credit (which does not include the course grade) when they return to Toronto.

Fees

The academic fees include the regular tuition to be paid to the University of Toronto for five full courses (but not incidental fees), plus the program fee of \$1 000.

Scholarships and Financial Assistance

There are a number of scholarships and bursaries offered by different offices at UofT, including the Department of French, the Admissions and Awards Office, individual Colleges, the International Student Exchange Office, and others. For more information please consult the individual offices, as well as the Department of French and the ISXO awards website.

Eligibility

To apply for the Nantes Program, students must be enrolled in a French program at UofT, have a GPA of at least 2.5 (B-), and have French language ability equivalent to a second-year university course.

* The Department of Modern Languages and Literatures of Trent University offers a Year-Abroad Program in Nantes, France, jointly run with the University of Waterloo and the University of Toronto, which enables students to spend a year studying in France while receiving full credits at their home university.

The program is hosted by the University of Nantes, and is taught by French professors and by a resident Canadian professor who accompanies the students, arranges their registration and installation in residences and organizes social and cultural activities throughout the year. As a result of the immersion setting and the numerous opportunities to interact in French with the local community, students achieve rapid and durable gains in their oral and comprehension skills.

The Program is intended for French Majors in their second or third years but students from other Majors or from other universities may also apply to participate.

The overall cost, including accommodation in residence, meals in a university restaurant, and return airfare is comparable to the cost incurred by a full-time student paying for a single residence room and full board at a Canadian university. Students who qualify for OSAP grants, Ontario loans, Canada student loans or for scholarships remain eligible for these grants and loans during the year abroad.

Along with Brock, Acadia and the University of British Columbia, Trent is a member of the Canada Year in Freiburg Program, an arrangement which makes it possible for 7 Trent students (along with 21 students from the other schools) to study at the Albert-Ludwigs-Universität Freiburg for one full academic year.

Participants with sufficient German skills upon arrival in Freiburg may take a regular course load, while those with only minimal fluency take German courses for their first semester and graduate to regular courses in the second term.

The Canadian students receive part of their instruction from the program's Resident Director, a faculty member of one of the four participating Canadian institutions who is also available to help students during their time abroad.

While abroad, students pay their regular tuition to their home institutions. Participation is not limited to students of the four member schools, but applicants from other Canadian universities advised that a letter of permission from one of the four member schools is required.

Western Ambassadorial Scholarship Student Exchange

The Western Student Exchange Outgoing Ambassadorial Scholarships are awarded to graduate or undergraduate students in upper years of their program wishing to study at one of the Partner universities for the full-year or one term.

The Awards are put in place to support students who might otherwise not be able to seize the opportunity to study at a partner institute in another country. For students undertaking a year of studies overseas, the award usually is \$1,000. For students undertaking one term of overseas studies, the award usually is \$500.

Value: Up to 2 at \$2 000 annually, only as funds permit Effective May 2000

A. Dorothy Turville Undergraduate Language Traveling Fellowships

Awarded annually on a competitive basis to undergraduates registered in the constituent University, who are entering the third year of an Honors Bachelor degree in either an Honors Specialization of a Language and Literature program in French, German, Russian, or Spanish or a double Major in two of these subjects. Preference will be given to students studying French and to those who propose to teach French in elementary or secondary schools. Students receiving an Interprovincial Bursary are not eligible to receive this award. Value: \$2 500 for students taking year three abroad in Europe, and \$500 for students taking year three in Quebec (Non Renewable)

Diana Beattie Exchange Scholarship

Financial Support: Exchange Scholarships

- **Rhone Alpes/Baden Württemberg Exchange**
Value \$500
Up to four awards will be offered to students traveling to either France or Germany to participate in international exchange with one of Laurier's regional exchange programs.
- **Student International Travel Scholarship**
Value \$500
This scholarship was established to assist Laurier students with the travel costs associated with an exchange program. Application for this scholarship may be made by Laurier students in any program of study, who are in good academic standing, and who are participating in an exchange program offered through Laurier International. Recipients will be selected, and the amount of the award will be determined, by the Director of Laurier International and the Vice-President: Academic. Recipients will be selected on the basis of their academic standing.
- **Viessmann/Marburg Scholarship**
Value \$1 050
This award is available to one Laurier student going on exchange to Marburg Germany for one year. Selection based on academic excellence and personal engagement as determined by the WLU faculty exchange selection committee.
- **Hans Viessmann International Scholarship**
Value 4 x \$500
These scholarships are intended to help WLU students who wish to study at a partnership institution in Germany. Other European destinations will be considered if funds are available. Students must be registered in full time studies and be in good academic standing.
- **Dr. W.J. Villaume Scholarship**
Value \$1 000
This award was created in honour of those professional colleagues of the 1960's

who propelled the new university toward a promising plateau of high scholarship, international diversity and academically gifted students. Awarded annually to an academically gifted student who will participate in an international exchange program.

The Mark and Gail Appel Program in Holocaust and Anti-Racist Education at York University: Learning From The Past, Teaching for the Future

In this biannual program, which is sponsored by York's Centre for Jewish Studies and the Canadian Centre of German and European Studies, York students entering a career in educational fields (e.g. school teacher, journalist, adult education, etc.) spend three weeks during the summer, in Germany and Poland, engaged in seminar discussions, lectures and tours of various Holocaust-related sites. The goal of this program is to educate the next generation of teachers in the issues surrounding the Holocaust. In between field study years, students gather for an international conference to exchange ideas and share information.

Overall 32 students take part in this program: 8 from York, 8 from the Université de Montréal, 8 from Polish partner institutions and 8 selected by the Baden-Württemberg Landeszentrale für politische Bildung (Stuttgart Office).

Funding

For the 2005-2006 cycle, the program is sponsored by the ERP Fund (Transatlantic Program) of the German Federal Ministry of Economics and Labour.

To facilitate participation, bursaries are available to help defray the great bulk of the costs involved, but students are expected to contribute \$500 plus pay for incidental expense and a few meals.

Please note: Faculty Exchange

Most of York’s bilateral German exchange agreements contain a clause stipulating that each institution agrees to welcome faculty members and research scholars from the other institution. There is generally no financial commitment associated with this. In practice, this translates into a situation whereby one institution will try to find an office or other working space for the visitor, and arrange for access to the library, computer facilities, etc.

Eligibility Criteria for Study Abroad programs (Osgoode Law School and Schulich School of Business see below)

- be an undergraduate student in an Honours program or graduate student of any discipline.
- have a minimum B average (6.0 GPA).
- It is recommended that students apply during your second year to spend your third year abroad.
- Some exchanges are restricted to certain disciplines.

Costs

Tuition fees to York and other expenses (Airfare and travel, Health and travel insurance, Fees for visa, passport and other documents, Accommodation, food, entertainment, books and general living expenses)

Financial Support

York International Mobility Award (YIMA)

In accordance with the York Internationalization Strategy, the York International Mobility Award (YIMA) has been developed. This is a needs-based program for registered degree students who demonstrate that financial need is a barrier to participating in an international mobility program.

Eligibility: Degree-seeking students who are registered at York may apply for a YIMA if they are selected to participate in any of the following programs:

- a formal exchange program with one of York's official partner universities
- an approved international study abroad program through a York department, faculty or research centre
- an approved international internship through a York department or faculty

Selection Criteria: For exchange students, the YIMA is intended to reduce the extra cost of airfare and any differences in cost of living. Individual award amounts will vary depending on the needs of the student, the program, the destination and the number of applications received. Awards may be pro-rated depending on the number of successful applicants. For study abroad and internship students, the YIMA is intended to reduce the extra cost of airfare. Individual award amounts will vary depending on the needs of the student, the program, the destination and the number of applications received. Awards may be pro-rated depending on the number of successful applicants. Please note that this program is not open to students at the Schulich School of Business

All Countries: Mann Award of Excellence for Study Abroad (Value: \$4 000)

This bursary was established through a gift from Dr. Susan Mann, President of York University, 1992-1997, to acknowledge her own introduction to 'study abroad' by her parents. Applicants must:

- be majoring in the Humanities, Social Science, Fine Arts or Sciences
- be pursuing full-time 3rd year studies in a formal York University Exchange Program in a country outside of Canada and the United States
- have demonstrated academic excellence and financial need
- be a Canadian citizen/landed immigrant and Ontario resident

This award is not open to students at the Schulich School of Business or Osgoode Law School.

Austria/Germany: Ahrens Scholarship (Value: \$600)

Applicants must:

- have at least a B+ average (7.0 gpa)
- have elected to travel to Germany/Austria under the year-abroad program

Selection is made by the Faculty of Arts, with preference given to a student majoring in German or German Studies.

Germany, Europe, Another country: The Joseph Webber Memorial Fund for International Education (Value: \$2 000 - \$3 000)

The Joseph Webber Memorial Fund for International Education honours the memory of Joseph Webber in accordance with his conviction that international study plays an important role in student's academic and personal development. The bursary will be awarded annually to both graduate and undergraduates (in approximately equal numbers) who have been selected by York University to study at a university in (1) Germany, (2) Europe, or (3) another country as part of their York degree program. Applicants must:

- demonstrate financial need
- be a Canadian citizen/landed immigrant and Ontario resident
- submit a report on their experiences to York International upon their return

Sweden: The Hakkan Berggren Fellowship (Value: \$1 000)

Awarded annually to one York University student nominated for exchange to Sweden. Applications will be distributed to students after nomination to the program. Selection is based on financial need and academic merit. The fellowship is valued at \$1 000.

Sweden: The York-Sweden Exchange Bursary (Value: \$1 000)

The York-Sweden Exchange Bursary is available to a full-time registered degree-seeking student who is nominated to one of York's university-wide exchange programs with a partner in Sweden and who demonstrates that financial need is a barrier to participation. First consideration for the award will go to a student selected for exchange with Umea University, Umea, Sweden. Students selected for York's other Swedish exchange programs will be considered if there is no student nominated for Umea or the students nominated for Umea do not show need.

Restrictions to students at the Schulich School of Business, Osgoode Law School and at Glendon College

- Students in the Schulich School of Business can apply only to exchange programs offered by Schulich.
- Osgoode Hall Law School students can apply to both York International administered and Osgoode International administered programs.
- Glendon College students can apply to both York International administered and Glendon College administered programs.
- Glendon Students can apply for York mobility grants and scholarships. They pay just normal Glendon tuition fees.

Osgoode Law School Information:

Eligibility Criteria:

- have a B average or above
- meet language, academic or other requirements laid down by the host university or under an exchange agreement.

Financial Support:

Special Osgoode Funding is available to students for exchange and summer programs at \$500 per term, providing:

- That the program in question is for credit and approved by the Assistant Dean

- That students demonstrate financial need for the period in question; and
- That students make an application prior to departure.

Schulich School of Business Information:

Eligibility for MBA students:

Any full- or part-time student enrolled in the MBA or IMBA programs may apply for one term of study abroad.

To be eligible for a term abroad, students must:

- Complete at least 24.0 credit-hours of MBA or IMBA courses, including all 5000-level required courses. This includes credit given for Advanced Standing.
- Attain a cumulative grade point average (GPA) of at least 5.5 (B) on those 24.0 credit-hours of courses.

Eligibility for BBA students

Any student enrolled in the Undergraduate program may apply for one study abroad term. Undergraduates may apply for a full academic year only in cases where partner schools offer a mandatory full year exchange program. To be eligible to participate in the Study Abroad Program, students must:

- Be in year 3 or year 4 for the proposed exchange term(s).
- Attain a cumulative grade point average (GPA) of at least 5.5 (C+) prior to the desired exchange term.

Costs: All Schulich students on exchange pay regular Schulich tuition fees to York University. Since students continue to be registered at an Ontario university during the Study Abroad term, they are still eligible to apply for loans, financial support and scholarships, including OSAP (Ontario Student Assistance Program).

Financial Support

Travel Bursary for MBA and BBA Students:

- After returning from the Exchange Term(s) students can apply for the *Travel Bursary* to cover air plane travel.
- The maximum reimbursement is \$2 500.

Exchange Bursary for MBA students

- Each semester a limited number of bursaries are available to full-time students who are participating in a study exchange abroad. These bursaries are awarded to MBA/IMBA students who have demonstrated financial need. The value of the Exchange Bursary is \$1 500.
